The Fairfax County Animal Shelter and Pender Veterinary Clinic, in partnership with the Office of Mason District Supervisor Penny Gross and the Mason District Station of the Fairfax County Police Department, will host a low-cost rabies clinic on **Sunday**, **September 11**, 12 to 2 p.m. for dogs and cats in the Main Community Room of the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale.

All dogs **must** be on leashes, and cats and ferrets **must** be in carriers. Fairfax County 2016 dog licenses will be sold separately and cost \$10. Cash and checks **only** will be accepted for payment at the clinic. The Quick 411 – Is there a place where I can learn more about the proposed meals tax in Fairfax County? Yes. The Board of Supervisors voted on June 7, 2016 to place a meals tax referendum on the November 8 election ballot. Information is available online at **www.fairfaxcounty.gov/mealstax** to enable residents and stakeholders to understand the process and the details of the meals tax referendum.

Graham Park Plaza Plan Amendment Advances to Next Step – On January 27, 2015, the Board of Supervisors authorized the consideration of a Comprehensive Plan amendment for Graham Park Plaza, formerly Loehmann's Plaza in the Jefferson Planning District. The current adopted Plan for this area recommends community-serving retail uses. The Board requested that county staff consider a mix of residential and nonresidential uses. Additionally, Plan analysis should provide attention to transportation, while planning for high-quality design for the shopping center. On Tuesday, September 27, 2016, county staff will present the draft Plan text to the Mason District Land Use Committee. The meeting will take place at the Mason District Governmental Center, 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale, beginning at 7:30 p.m. The Plan Amendment also has public hearings before the Planning Commission scheduled for Thursday, October 20 at 8:15 p.m., and before the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, December 6 at 4 p.m.
