School Board Votes to Change Name of J.E.B. Stuart H.S.

Community Meeting and Voting Scheduled for September

On July 27, 2017, the Fairfax County School Board voted to change the name of J.E.B. Stuart High School no later than the start of the 2019 School Year. The renaming process will start this fall. As part of the process, and in recognition of the need to minimize costs, the School Board requests the Stuart community consider "Stuart High School" as the new name. The Board has directed staff to create a mechanism for private funding

with the expectation that private funding will pay for a substantial portion of the costs. An open public meeting will be held on **Saturday, September 9**, at 10 a.m., at J.E.B. Stuart High School to gather names for consideration along with the opportunity for presentations, questions, and discussion. Voting for the school name will be limited to those participants residing in the school's attendance area. Voting will take place on **Saturday**,

September 16, at J.E.B. Stuart High School and will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. After review of the community's recommendations, the Division Superintendent will formulate a recommendation consisting of one or more of the most popular choices according to community input. The Division Superintendent will transmit the recommendations to the School Board for consideration and action.

have plummeted to the ground, and our systems of modern life have crumbled. The Amish, with their stocked larders and stores of supplies, are at first unaffected. But as the English (what the Amish call all non-Amish) become more and more desperate, they begin to invade Amish farms, taking whatever they want from the peaceable community. Though the novel (written as journal entries by an Amishman) has an intentionally patient, gentle, "plain" pace, it's been getting some great reviews. It was elected as one of Amazon's 10

Best Books of July. The Boston Globe called it: "Entrancing..... holding, at times, the power of prayer." The L.A. Times said: "It's rare to find a debut novel so finely crafted." So if you're interested in an end of the summer read by a Sleepy Hollow Woods resident, give it a try. It's available on Amazon, at Barnes and Noble, at locally owned independent bookstores, and wherever books are sold.

Oak Tree Owners Watch for Seasonal Defoliators – The orange striped oakworm (*Anisota senatoria*) is a native moth that feeds on oak trees in late summer and early fall. Diagnostic: Leaves will be stripped except for mid-ribs (or "veins"), usually isolated to specific branches or sections of the tree. This may occur in late summer/early fall, but does not pose much threat to the trees because trees are preparing to lose their leaves for winter and are not depending on them as heavily for food as they would in the spring or early summer. Treatment isn't warranted usually for this pest because it occurs later in the year when trees are not as stressed by defoliation. Affected branches may be pruned if unsightly.
