Modular Roundabout Coming to Ravensworth Road

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) will test a modular mini roundabout at the intersection of Ravensworth Road at Jayhawk Street in Annandale, and evaluate its function to provide safety and traffic flow improvement through the intersection. FHWA identified this intersection as a candidate for the pilot project because it meets thresholds for a traffic signal, *(Roundabout Continued page 2)*

and the roundabout can be installed without relocating utilities, drainage, or disruption to the existing pavement. VDOT plans to install the roundabout and modular island this spring. Two weeks prior to commencing the work, VDOT will place message boards to notify the public about the start of construction. Remember to mark your calendars now for the Sleepy Hollow Woods Wine and Cheese Social. This event-which has become a Wood's favorite—will kick off on Saturday, April 21, 2018, beginning at 7pm, at St. Alban's, in Frizzell Hall. Come celebrate the beginning of spring with many of your friends and neighbors while sipping wines from all around the world and enjoying cheese pairings to go with your wine. Selections of both wine and cheese vary, however in years past, wines from Italy, Portugal, France, and United States have been represented. Past cheese pairings have included stilton, chevre, cambozola, and vintage cheddars just to name a few. For

anyone new to the Woods, this is a great opportunity to unwind, learn about wines and various pairings, and meet your neighbors. You will also have the opportunity to take notes on what you liked and be able to ask our resident sommeliers any questions you might have. The cost to attend this event is \$15 per person, and will be collected at the door. This is a self-supporting event and each year money collected covers costs. Attendees are encouraged to bring friends, however please note that this is an adult only event. Look for the evite in order to RSVP. Native Seedling Sale Features Deer Tolerant Species

The Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District will be selling a collection of trees and shrubs that are tolerant of deer browse. While no plant is completely deer-proof, these seedlings are less susceptible. They help clean our water and air, prevent soil erosion, provide valuable habitat, and add beauty and resilience to your landscape. The Bare-Root Shrub and Small Tree package includes Witchhazel, False Indigobush, Serviceberry, Silky Dogwood, and Spice-bush, and is available for \$16.95. The Bare-Root Trees package includes Redbud, Pawpaw, and Shortleaf Pine, and is available for \$11.95. Orders can be placed online (credit or debit card) or placed by phone (checks accepted). A full, non-refundable payment must accompany all orders, and payment must be received by Wednesday, April 11, 2018 or while supplies last. Extra Trash or Yard Waste? Why not Use a "Special Collection"

Many neighbors have commented on the lingering piles of trash or yard waste along curbs, so we are encouraging everyone to utilize "Special Collections" as part of your Fairfax County trash and recycling service. Whether you are doing some spring cleaning or additional yard work, please consider scheduling a special pickup to haul away excess rubbish during the normal trash day.

SHW News Briefs

Five "Special Collections" are permitted for every residence per year and can be easily scheduled through the website (https:// specialpickup.fairfaxcounty.gov) or calling 703-802-3322, TTY 711. Pickups can be scheduled one day in advance with options including brush, bulk, metal, or refrigerant (coolant). Please reference additional information available at the website noted above and help keep our Neighborhood looking great!
